Supply List

Workshop Description:

Learn to crochet a sampler afghan or baby afghan using basic pattern stitches from the book 63 Easy-To-Crochet Pattern Stitches. Mix and match the blocks as you like while developing pattern reading skills. At least 2 blocks of your choice will be covered each month. Expect to complete homework between sessions.

Workshop Prerequisites:

Beginner to experienced crochet skills

Required Supplies:

- Yarn: 2 skeins - The yarn weight and fiber content can be of your choosing: wool, baby, worsted, etc.
- Book: 63 Easy-To-Crochet Pattern Stitches (available at Customer Service)
- H-8 crochet hook
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Ruler or tape measure
- Pen or pencil
